He was sent to Chariton County Mission to restore law and order and defeat the bushwhackers and other irregular forces of the Confederate states who were active in the area. According to this account Benecke dismissed over 1000 Missouri Militia from his command, purchased Spencer rifles for his company and eliminated bushwhacking in the area. The episode that this pamphlet addresses is whether Captain Benecke was responsible for the death of a bushwhacker named John W. Leonard who was executed by members of Benecke's command in retaliation for the death of William Carter, a farrier who was removed from his home, stripped, hung, and shot over 30 times by bushwhacker Jim Jackson's gang of which Leonard was supposedly a member. Debs, Eugene V. **DEBS: HIS LIFE, WRITINGS, AND SPEECHES WITH A DEPARTMENT OF APPRECIATIONS.** Chicago, IL 1908. 515 pages. A labor union leader and a founder of the Socialist Party in America, Debs was that party's Presidential candidate in five different elections between 1900 and 1920. This volume, published by the Socialist weekly, *The Appeal to Reason*, collects many of his articles and speeches, adding a brief biography and several appreciations. Debs inscribed this copy on the front free endpaper on Christmas day in the year of publication, "To Claude Bowers With affectionate esteem and all good wishes From his friend Eugene V. Debs December 25th 1908." This is almost certainly Claude G. Bowers, the noted historian (especially of Jefferson), journalist, and diplomat, who in 1908 was a newspaperman and public official in Terre Haute, IN, Debs' hometown.
